RACE, CLASS, AND GENDER

- Students should develop an understanding of the nature of race, ethnicity, gender, sexuality and class and the impact these concepts have upon our lives in the United States.
- Students will begin to demonstrate well-developed, confident identities as good writers and speakers who can communicate clearly and effectively.
- These topics are full, non-remedial topics taught at the pace of a college summer course.
- Students will apply the study and cognitive skills learned from their Foundations of Student Success course
